I worked as the interior designer on a large commercial project where North & South Construction Services was the general contractor. We converted a church into corporate offices for the National Center for the Advancement of Educational Assessment. The building had parts that were originally built over one hundred years ago, and the client wished to preserve the feel of the building while bringing it into the 21<sup>st</sup> century.

From the very beginning, working with Any Tobin and Bruce Allain from North & South was a pleasure. They were always respectful, and full of ideas to save money while adding value to the project. As the project progressed, communication with them was very easy, and the people we needed to speak with were readily accessible. If the client or I had a question, they were never too busy to help us with the answer.
